Understanding the Basics of Jacks or Better

The Core Strategy: What to Hold and What to Fold

The heart of Jacks or Better strategy is a set of rules dictating which cards to keep. Your goal is to maximize your expected value on every single hand. Follow these rules in order of priority. If your hand matches a higher rule, disregard the lower ones.

1. **Always hold a pat hand:** This means a winning hand that doesn't require a draw: a straight, flush, full house, or four of a kind. The only exception is a low pair (10s or lower), which you should break up if you have four cards to a royal flush.
2. **Hold four cards to a royal flush:** The royal flush is the jackpot, so this is your highest priority draw.
3. **Hold a straight, three of a kind, or four cards to a straight flush.**
4. **Hold a pair of Jacks or better.** Never break up a high pair.
5. **Hold four cards to a flush.**
6. **Hold a low pair (10s or lower).** This gives you a good chance to improve to two pair or three of a kind.
7. **Hold three cards to a royal flush.**



8. **Hold four cards to an open-ended straight.** (e.g., 5-6-7-8).
9. If none of the above apply, hold two high cards (Jacks or better). If you have fewer than two, discard everything and draw five new cards.

Common Beginner Mistakes to Avoid

New players often fall into traps that reduce their payback percentage. Avoid these common errors:

- **Holding a low kicker:** Never hold an unsuited high card with a low card “just in case.” For example, if you have a King and a 4, discard the 4. You want to maximize your chances of drawing another high card.
- **Not going for the flush/straight:** If you have four cards to a flush, it’s almost always the correct play, even over holding a single high card.
- **Overvaluing a pair:** While a low pair is a good hold, it ranks below four-card straights and flushes. Don’t be afraid to break up a pair of 8s if you have a potential flush.

Strategy manages your play, but bankroll management manages your money. Even with perfect strategy, you will have losing sessions due to variance. A solid bankroll plan prevents a few bad hands from wiping you out. A good rule of thumb is to have at least 50-100 times the coin value you are playing per session. For example, if you



play £0.50 per coin (£2.50 per hand), a £50-£100 bankroll is recommended. The table below outlines a sample session plan.

Coin Denomination	Bet Per Hand	Recommended Session Bankroll	Win/Loss Stop-Limit
£0.10	£0.50	£25 – £50	Stop after £10 loss or £20 win
£0.25	£1.25	£60 – £125	Stop after £25 loss or £50 win
£0.50	£2.50	£125 – £250	Stop after £50 loss or £100 win
£1.00	£5.00	£250 – £500	Stop after £100 loss or £200 win
